


PROGRAM EXPECTATIONS

NON-NEGOTIABLES

If a youth participates in/demonstrates one of these behaviors, they are immediately released from the C5 program.

- Alcohol, illegal drug, tobacco, or weapon use at any C5 Function
- Engagement in criminal activity anywhere, anytime
- Sexual activity at any C5 Function
- Expulsion from school
- Repeated violations of C5 rules and expectations
- Intentional cause of, or attempt to cause, significant physical/emotional injury
- Gang involvement

Flint Year - Leading Myself


Camp Leadership University (Part 1)
